COVID-19 TESTING	Testing is Prioritized and Strongly Encouraged for: Symptomatic persons with: • Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting, and Diarrhea. Symptomatic persons who are: • Hospitalized • Healthcare workers and other first responders • Employees and residents in group living settings, and • Over 65 years old or with <u>underlying health conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of serious complications Asymptomatic persons: • If they are part of a public health investigation • If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters • If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19, or • If they are an essential worker. Prioritization of routine testing among other asymptomatic people is not recommended at this time. People over the age of 65 or with underlying conditions do not necessarily need to be tested unless they have symptoms, have had an exposure or have been told by public health to be tested. Once again, please check with your healthcare provider about your specific situation and let their medical advice guide you.

For more information Click Here. • As of 8/4/20, Access Services has completed over 225,696 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects. • This week, #LetsFeedLACounty is hosting 2 drive-thru food distribution events in East Los Angeles and in Paramount. • To date, at 22 events, #LetsFeedLACounty has distributed 1,298 tons of food to 39,671 households. • Drive-thru food distribution events have been extended through the end of August. • Drive-thru food distribution events held in Lake View Terrace and Florence-Firestone where 1,950 and 1,423 households. Each were provided 80 pounds of food, including shelf-stable items, dairy product frozen meat, and fresh produce. • #LetsFeedLACounty has secured 400 20-pound boxes of groceries from the LA Regional Food Bank for weekly delivery through the end of December to clients of the DHS Housing for Health program. • The LAUSD “Grab & Go” Food Centers are open, Monday through Friday from 8-11a.m. through August 14, 2020. As of Monday, June 22, 2020, the “Grab & Go Food Center” at Verdugo Hills High School moved to Mount Gleason Middle School. • Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon. • Great Plates Delivered has a current service population of 4,174 seniors (63% increase since June) with a total of 529,908 meals served. • The Great Plates Delivered Program has contracted with 55d meal providers that are employing 1,161 people. 64% of meal providers are minority-owned businesses. • Great Plates Program has been extended until September 9, 2020. • Elder Nutrition Program has a current service current population of 16,657 seniors.
